95-1.01 Telephone listing.

95-1.02 Purchasing another's practice; using seller's name.

95-1.03 Casting feet.

95-1.01 Telephone listings.—

(1) A podiatrist may cause himself to be listed in the classified section of any telephone directory in the State of Florida.

(2) In the event a podiatrist has two or more bona fide offices, he may list all his office addresses under his one listing, but without elaboration as to days of week spent in any location, or any other matter other than that permitted in the following rule:

(3) Telephone listing shall not include more than the following:

Name and Dr. (or degree, which is optional)
Street number and/or building name and city
If no answer dial—(referred number)

95-1.02 Purchasing another's practice; using seller's name.—

(1) In the event a doctor has purchased the practice of another doctor, the purchaser may have inserted after his own name, "Formerly Dr. X's office" for a period not to exceed three consecutive calendar years.

(2) In the event a doctor has purchased the practice of another doctor, the buyer is allowed to use for a period of three consecutive calendar years from the time of said purchase the name of the seller, provided however, that

the name of the seller is displayed directly beneath the name of the buyer in any sign permitted by the Code of Ethics of the Florida Podiatry Association, or on stationery or professional cards likewise permitted. Only the words, "Formerly Dr. X's office", will be permitted. The Florida State Board of Chiropractic Examiners reserves the right to require the purchaser to prove the legality of any such purchase. If the purchaser perpetrates a fraud, he may have his license to practice chiropractic suspended or revoked in accordance with §461.17, Florida Statutes.

95-1.03 Casting feet.—The practice of casting feet (making reproductions of feet or parts of feet thereof from any chemical substance, especially plaster), for the purpose of fabricating any and all orthopedic foot appliances (prosthetics) and moulded shoes, and the making of such orthopedic foot appliances (prosthetics) and moulded shoes from such casts is a violation of Chapter 461, Florida Statutes, when such orthopedic appliances or moulded shoes or prosthetics or casts are made by unlicensed persons and where such appliances, shoes, or prosthetics whether made from cast or not are applied for the correction of an abnormal or orthopedic ailment.
